
## Region 7 Federal Sustainable Communities Partnership

#### EPA Region 7 Historic Highways Project

- Goal is to identify and overcome environmental conditions at former gas station sites along two historic highways in the Region and assist with developing reuse options of the site and its surroundings.
- Inventory of former gas stations along former Route 66 (Missouri and Kansas) and former Lincoln Highway (Iowa and Nebraska)
- 218 stations in 115 (mostly rural) communities.



















#### Ogden, Iowa



#### Market assessment looked at:

- population trends and other demographic info
- retail market analysis
- promotional and marketing opportunities

### Population Trends and Other Demographic Information

- Ogden's population is declining; Boone County is flat; state is growing.
- Boone County and Ogden have a median age higher than state and national levels.
- Income levels are higher than state; poverty levels are lower.
- Percentage of owneroccupied housing is much higher than state and national percentages.



Population level and change	2008	2007	2000	Change 2000-2008	% Change 2000-2008
Ogden	1,986	1,987	2,016	-30	-1.5%
Boone County	26,391	26,325	26,300	91	0.3%
State of Iowa	2,988,046	2,972,566	2,869,413	118,633	4.1%



#### Retail Market Assessment

- 66% of the county's retail businesses are in Boone.
- 86% of the county's spending was in Boone.
- Boone (12, 802) had total retail sales \$136.6 million; pull factor 1.05.
- Madrid (2,367) retail sales \$12.04 million; pull factor of 0.52.
- Ogden (2,037) retail sales \$7.42 million; pull factor of 0.37.



Real sales per capita have declined in Ogden since the mid 1980s.



#### Promoting Ogden

- Economic vitality requires economic support from outside the city
- Take advantage of promotions of outside groups: Boone County, Chamber, State
- Tie local activities to larger initiatives
- Improve municipal website







#### Sutherland, Nebraska


- 5 former gas station sites in Sutherland.

- Met with City Clerk, Director of Village Board of Supervisors.
- Involvement of Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality.
- Involvement of Federal Sustainable Communities Partnership (FHWA and USDA RD).















#### Sutherland, Nebraska

#### Developing revitalization strategy to:

- 1. Make physical improvements to former gas station sites and other underutilized properties along with infrastructure.
- 2. Organize and meet regularly to prioritize actions.
- 3. Promote Sutherland's assets.















#### **USDA RD Involvement**

#### Involvement by federal partners;

#### **USDA RD**

- 1. Potential funding resource.
- 2. RD programs for infrastructure, community facilities, business development and housing.
- 3. Participation in both Ogden and Sutherland in community visits and planning meetings.
- 4. As plan is implemented, RD will work with the communities to identify and pursue funding options.
- Possible future funding from FHWA and HUD.
