






## New Haven-Hartford-Springfield Commuter Rail (NHHS)

- 30 trains/day (12 today)
- Shuttle to BDL airport
- 8 stations
- 2014 service
- Connects to Hartford-New Britain Busway




# Hartford-New Britain Busway

- 9.4 mi
- 11 Stations (incl. Union Station)
- 5 feeder bus routes
- Service in 2014



# Massachusetts Amtrak Realignment



- Cuts travel time 1/3
- 4 stations in Mass.
- Existing bus link to UMass/Amherst
- Service in 2013





# Knowledge Corridor Transportation Investments (5-year horizon)

Vermont Rail Improvements	\$65 M
Mass. Amtrak Connecticut River Line Restoration	\$73 M
Springfield Union Station	\$74 M
New Haven-Hartford-Springfield Commuter Rail	\$647 M
Hartford-New Britain Bus Transitway	\$567 M
Hartford Union Station	TBD
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$1.4 Billion</b>

# TOD Market Analysis


*Establishing expectations for growth*

- ✓ Clear recommendations for public policy makers






## Scale 1: Regional


