

Key Federal Programs for Bikeable, Walkable Communities






Recreational Trails Program

Programs are Working

- Bicycling & walking rates increasing: 40% increase in bicycling nationally 2000-2009
- Sidewalks and paths reduce injuries and fatalities
- Kids who walk/bike to school are less obese, more likely to meet physical activity guidelines
- SR2S programs reduce school busing costs, ease traffic congestion at schools, lower medical costs



Senate Bill: MAP-21

- Combines 3 core programs under "Additional Activities"
- Adds expensive new eligibilities to compete for <u>less</u>money
- Provides opt-out to transfer funds elsewhere



House Bill: American Energy & Infrastructure Jobs Act



- Eliminates dedicated funding for TE & removes some categories, including rail-trail
- Eliminates SR2S
- Rec Trails program intact
- Eliminates \$ for State DOT bike/ped coordinators

Get Involved – Improve the Bill


Petri-Johnson Amendment:



- Restores SR2S and TE funding to 2012 levels
- Restores TE category for rail-trails
- Restores funding for 2
 State coordinators
