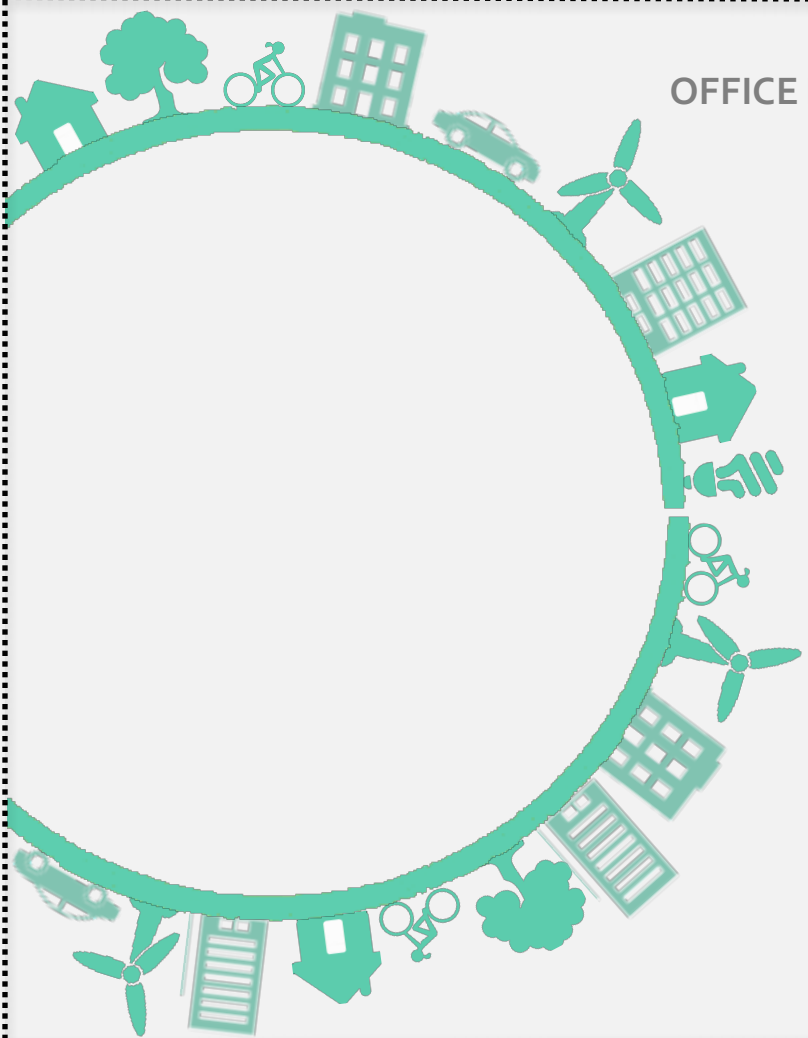

HISTORY

HUD established an International Affairs office 22 years ago as a diplomatic liaison for international counterparts.

Seven years ago, Philanthropic Innovation was added to ensure the office partnered internationally and domestically to foster strategic global relationships that could generate resources, knowledge, and partnerships directly benefiting HUD's mission and core goals.

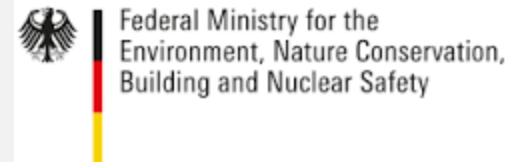
